From the Director's Desk

### **History Matters for Kids**

Those of us that work and volunteer here are lucky. We get to see daily the impact that sharing history with your children and grandchildren really is. We witness first hand the excitement of more than 10,000 elementary school age children every year as they experience the sights, sounds, smells and tastes of the days of old.

Imagine how it would be if our children didn't have the opportunity to visit a place like ours to learn about what life was like during the late 1800's and early 1900's in Florida. What if they didn't get to dip candles and dream of how it would be to live in a time before electricity and smart phones? What if they didn't get to see the blacksmith forging a hook or hear the hiss of the hot iron when it hits the cool water or the pound of the hammer on the anvil? How unfortunate it would be for our kids to not hear the stories and experience a sampling of the hardships our ancestors faced daily for survival. Like feeding the farm animals, tending the garden, gathering eggs, making butter and spinning and



weaving for clothing and blankets, carving kitchen tools in the woodshop and all this without today's modern conveniences like running water, refrigeration and air conditioning.

The hands-on activities that we provide during a field trip compliment your children's classroom learning and help to instill the teachings of the early Florida lifestyle. Presenting these activities in our historic buildings is a huge bonus. The atmosphere of the schoolhouse, cabin, wood shop, barn and blacksmith shop bring history to life and further inspire these young minds.

Our adult visitors also enjoy reminiscing of a time before everything became so automatic.

Many also have fond memories of a visit here on a field trip when they were in elementary school.

A benefit of our programs is presenting them in an authentic atmosphere conducive to learning. An important part of that is providing a safe and stable environment which is why our infrastructure is also imperative to both us and you.

The preservation, upkeep and continued maintenance of our historical structures is fundamental to our existence and essential for our ability to provide an authentic backdrop for our educational programs. Not to overlook the many events that we host and that many of our structures also house thousands of historical artifacts.

We are looking forward to a new roof for the Astor Bridge House in January 2017 which we have been fundraising for, for a very long time. We thank all of you for your contributions towards that endeavor. The Turpentine Still and Past Time Tour Boat are among the priority list along with finishing the restoration of Volusia County's oldest brick residence the historic Joseph Underhill House. Future plans are to utilize the Underhill House to demonstrate brick making and show that even the upper middle class of the late 1800's time period had to work hard to survive.
